### Purim



Purim 2026 begins at sundown on Monday, March 2, 2026, or 14 Adar on the Hebrew calendar, and concludes at nightfall on Tuesday, March 3, 2026. Purim is a joyous holiday that celebrates the deliverance of the Jews of ancient Persia from near-destruction at the hands of Haman, an adviser to King Ahasuerus. As told in the Scroll of Esther, the story recounts how the Jews were saved thanks to Esther, a Jewish woman chosen to be queen. Due to her courage and her role in saving the Jews, the story of Purim is named in her honor.

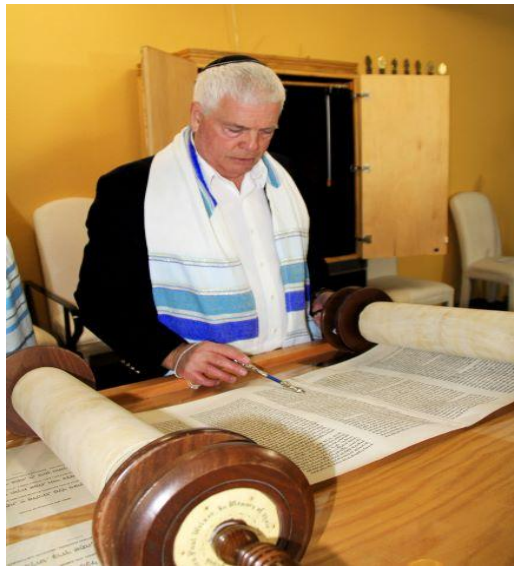

## **BIMA 101**

**2026**

### **Candle Lighting**

Usually, an “honor” which is given to one of the ladies of our congregation. The lady reciting the blessing should be Jewish. A tallit need not be worn for this honor. The blessing should be read or chanted in Hebrew followed by reading it in English. See the end of this article for blessings.

### **Tallit**

Should be worn by anyone coming to the Bima for anything to do with the Torah. This would include carrying the Torah, an Aliyah, lifting and dressing the Torah and even opening the ark. See the end of this article for blessings.

### **Kippah**

Should be worn by anyone coming to the Bima whether just reading something or leading a prayer.

### **Ark**

Should be opened and closed by those wearing a tallit and a kippah. The congregation should stand whenever the ark is open. The person approaching the ark should be Jewish.

## **Torah**

### **Aliyah**

An Aliyah to the Torah is an honor and should be treated as such. The oleh should be able to recite the blessings before and after the reading of the Torah. A Hebrew and English transliterated version is always on the Bima to assist the oleh. As mentioned, a few lines earlier the oleh should be wearing a tallit and a kippah. The oleh must be Jewish. See the end of this article for blessings.

### **Baal Korey**

This is the title of the person reading the Torah. The reader could be any congregant who is capable. The individual should be Jewish.

### **Gabai**

A congregant who is able to read Hebrew well should be following the reading of the Torah so no mistakes are made in the pronunciation of the words.

### **Hagbah and G'lilah**

Hagbah, the lifting and G'lilah, the dressing of the Torah is an honor. The title of the person lifting the Torah is Magbiah. The title of the person dressing the Torah is Golel. Both people should be Jewish and wearing tallit and kippah as mentioned earlier.

### ***Who is eligible to be invited to the Bima?***

#### **Leading prayers**

Congregants that are Jewish and family members for special occasions.

#### **Opening Ark**

Congregants that are Jewish and family members for special occasions.

### **Various readings**

Congregants including those that are part of our synagogue family that may not be Jewish.

*Below are commonly used blessings.*

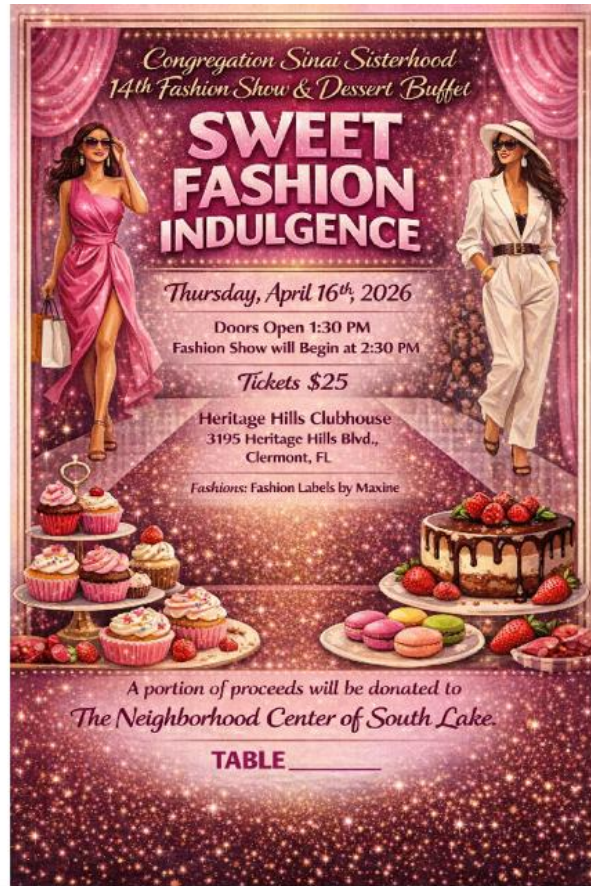
### **April 16 – Annual Sisterhood Fundraiser**
