Recipes of the Month



Joe's Pecan Pie

1 cup karo syrup light
1 cup light brown sugar
1 tsp vanilla
4 eggs
1 pinch salt
1/2 stick of butter (1/8 lb.) melted
1 cup pecan halves

Beat eggs, brown sugar, vanilla, karo and salt using low speed on mixer.

Add melted butter and continue to beat with mixer on low speed just enough to blend.

Put pecan pieces in 9" deep dish pie shell and add liquid mixture.

Bake at 350 for about 55 minutes.



Easy Hamantaschen

A favorite treat for the Purim holiday! It has always worked better for me if I cover the dough and refrigerate overnight. Gwen

Prep:

15 mins Cook: 12 mins Total: 27 mins

Yield:24 cookies

Ingredients:

- · 3 eggs
- · 1 cup granulated sugar
- · ¾ cup vegetable oil
- · 2 ½ teaspoons vanilla extract
- · ½ cup orange juice
- · 5 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- · 1 tablespoon baking powder
- · 1 cup fruit preserves, any flavor

Directions

Step 1

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease cookie sheet .

Step 2

In a large bowl, beat the eggs and sugar until light and fluffy. Stir in the oil, vanilla, and orange juice. Combine the flour and baking powder; stir into the batter to form a stiff dough. If dough is not stiff enough to roll out, stir in more flour. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough out to 1/4 inch in thickness. Cut into circles using a cookie cutter or the rim or a drinking glass. Place cookies 2 inches apart onto the prepared cookie sheets. Spoon about 2 teaspoons of preserves into the center of each one. Pinch the edges to form three corners. Some other favorite fillings are mini chocolate chips, mini M&Ms and Peanut butter.

Step 3

Bake for 12 to 15 minutes in the preheated oven, or until lightly browned. Allow cookies to cool for 1 minute on the cookie sheet before removing them to wire racks to cool completely.

Please don't forget about our furry friends by donating unopened dog food, towels, sheets and blankets.


Your contributions to Sisterhood by sending tributes, using Raise Right, participating in our events etc., do make a difference. YOU are greatly appreciated.


